Identified Gap

- Several exercises and real-world incidents revealed a regional gap in first responders' ability to meet the needs of some groups of people with disabilities
- Identified a need for increased:
 - Awareness
 - Tools and
 - Resources

Assessment & Research

- Surveys, interviews and focus groups with first responders, people with disabilities and personnel from human services agencies
- First responders noted a need for training to help with response
- People with disabilities noted stigma is one of the biggest obstacles when working with first responders
- All groups identified a need for field accessible resource manual/toolbox which can be consulted prior to and during response
