Upcoming Trainigns in Fall 2023

The Western Region Homeland Security Council is finalizing logistics for several exciting and timely trainings this fall. Watch you email for registration announcements for the following trainings.

Active Attack Integrated Response Training

Rescue Task Force training for Police, Fire and EMS. This series will include a Train-the-Trainer session, followed by several sessions of the two-day training to provide the recently trained instructors the opportunity to teach along side seasoned instructors. Sessions will be held throughout the region.





Nero's Law Practical Training

WRHSAC is collaborating with WMEMS to provide the practical training portion of the Nero's Law requirement for EMS. This hand's on training will provide EMS the opportunity to practice skills on live dogs and mannequins. Multiple sessions will be held throughout the region.

Advanced Hydraulic Rescue Training

This training builds on the Vehicle Lift and Stabilization Trainings WRHSAC conducted last year. It will provide students with a further understanding of the various extrication principles available to fire and rescue services when dealing with today's vehicles. One session will be held in Springfield in late October.



CISA K-12 Cybersecurity Resources

Cybersecurity is a growing concern for education and technology leaders in K-12 communities. To address these concerns, the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency(CISA) of DHS released a K-12 cybersecurity report with an accompanying <u>toolkit</u> to provide schools targeted resources to improve their cybersecurity. These resources identify

specific actions schools can take to drastically reduce their cybersecurity risk. CISA strongly encourages school leaders to review these actions ahead of the start of the school year.
